LJMU Response

Since the academic year, 2017/18 LJMU has not investigated any incidents of rape/sexual misconduct or sexual harassment under the provisions of its student disciplinary process.

Students convicted of a crime by the criminal justice system can be subject to further sanctions including expulsion under LJMU's Criminal Convictions policy.



Policy, as I am aware that some universities define all of the above as "sexual misconduct". Sexual misconduct may cover all forms of sexual violence, including sex without consent, sexual abuse (including online and imagebased abuse), non-consensual sexual touching, sexual harassment (unwanted behaviour of a sexual nature which violates your dignity; makes you feel intimidated, degraded or humiliated or creates a hostile or offensive environment), stalking, abusive or degrading remarks of a sexual nature, and a vast range of other behaviours.

Our IT Services team, when it receives a report of a cyber-attack would log it as an incident along with all other requests for assistance they receives. These logs are not searchable by key term. To locate records of any detected cyber-attacks, each of these logs would need to be manually checked. Due to the large volume of these logs, (in excess of 30,000 for a year) the costs involved in locating these records would be disproportionate.

The FOIA at Section 12 puts a limit of £450 on the costs the University should need to incur in responding to a request for information. Any request costing in excess of this should be refused.

Due to the volume of IT incident logs held, the costs of manual analysis would be in excess of £450.

It is the judgement of the legally authorised qualified person, the Vice Chancellor and Chief Executive, to refuse disclosure under Section 36(2)(c) of the FOIA as to do so would "be likely to prejudice the effective conduct of public affairs". This is because the document is currently in the process of drafting and approval. LJMU feels that disclosure of a draft version would prejudice the ability to conduct this important process effectively.

As a qualified exemption, the university believes that maintaining the exemption outweighs the public interest in disclosure. We have considered the importance of preserving a safe space for effective policy and review formulation without outside pressure to be of greater benefit than any public interest in transparency of this process. It is certainly not in the public interest for the process of policy review to be compromised in a year were our students have already experienced significant changes to the way they study.

LJMU offers courses in English Literature, run by the School of Humanities and Social Sciences, and Drama Courses run by the Liverpool Screen School.
