BrowZine


<u>BrowZine</u> is an app (and website) enabling users to browse, read and monitor e-journals from different publishers in one simple interface. For more information, view the <u>Introduction to BrowZine video</u>.

An app is also available from <u>Apple</u>, <u>GooglePlay</u> or <u>Amazon</u>, which will give more functionality and allow journals and articles to be saved to your BrowZine bookshelf (once you <u>Sign up for BrowZine</u>).

- Browse thousands of top journals by subject and easily review tables of contents.
- Add favourites titles to your bookshelf.
- Be alerted when new articles are available in your favourite journals.
- Sync across your desktop and mobile devices.
- Save and export articles. Use the BrowZine app to save articles for off-line reading on your smartphone/tablet or export to services such as Endnote.

Using the App version

- Download the App from the App Store, Google play or Amazon appstore
- Choose your library type in Liverpool John Moores University in the box
- Login to with your University Username and Password
- Select Continue
- Browse or search for a journal title





My Bookshelf

If you want to create your own bookshelf with your favourite journals or store articles you can create a login.

- Select the title to add a journal to a bookshelf
- Login or create an account
- Select the **3 dots** menu from a journal
- Select Add to My Bookshelf

You can have several Bookcases within the Bookshelf and use this to organise journals into separate subjects or modules.

You can add arcles to 'My Articles' by selecting the File icon from within a Journal. This will add the artcile to 'General Collection' you can create your own Colletions to organise article.

Full text PDF can be vewed from within the app and there are also options such as 'Export Citation' to Endnote etc. or 'Share'.

The **My Bookshelf** icon alert you to unread new articles in your saved journals, this appears as a red bubble.
