Democracy

A wave of democratisation swept the world after the Cold War due to the collapse of the most prevalent alternative (Barry Gills and Joel Rocamora, 1992)



Poverty/Socio-economic Rights

Outside of China, poverty in 2020 was at similar levels to 1990 (Philip Alston, UN Special Rapporteur on Extreme Poverty and Human Rights, 2020)

Human Rights Implications

Evidence of a failure, on the part of states, to protect, respect, and fulfil socio-economic rights like the rights to an adequate standard of living and social security Has the project of democratisation failed in this respect?

Should democracy give way if it is incapable of protecting citizens?
